Pre-AP classes offered in Language Arts, Math, Texas History, and Science. The curriculum is covered at a rapid pace and courses are designed to be challenging. Outside research, projects, readings, and homework are essential to a student's success in these classes. Additional assignments may be given during the summer or holidays. Students must maintain passing grade averages to remain in these courses.

REQUIRED-Student must choose ONE of the following:

____ **76371 / 76370 Athletics-A physical and completed athletic packet is required** for this course. Students in athletics must participate in competitive sports within the class period. Boys' sports include football and basketball. Girls' sports include volleyball and basketball. ***If a student wants to participate in cross-country, track, or soccer, the student will enroll in PE.*** If a student does not make a team after a tryout period, the student will go through training in an off-season program. **Students must maintain passing grades each six weeks to be eligible to participate.**

____ **86361 Tennis-A physical and completed athletic packet is required** for this course. Students must try-out and make a team to remain in the class. **Students must maintain passing grades each six weeks to be eligible to participate.**

____ **76360 Physical Education (required for students not in Athletics)**-class involves students in a regular fitness awareness program, including group activities and individual development. Goals include development of sportsmanship, awareness of others, team effort, and social skills. **Changing into gym clothes daily is a requirement.**

ELECTIVES:

_____ **CHOIR** - advanced vocal techniques and music reading skills. *Director Signature* _____

_____ **BAND** - advanced instrumental techniques and music reading skills on brass, woodwind or percussion instruments. Previous band experience is required. *Director Signature* _____

_____ **ORCHESTRA** - advanced instrumental techniques and music reading skills on string instruments. Previous orchestra experience is required. *Director Signature* _____

_____ **85340 FOUNDATIONS OF ART**-A project-oriented class, which introduces students to hands-on activities utilizing line, color, design, illustrations, sketching, painting, and shading techniques.

_____ **85330 THEATRE ARTS**-Designed as an introduction to theater, drama, public speaking, and stage design.
ADVANCED THEATRE ARTS - Students perform and/or are a member of stage crew for UIL **One Act Play** and school performances. Considerable time outside of school during spring semester may be required. Students must maintain passing grades for eligibility.

_____ **88302 LEADWORTHY (formerly Teen Leadership)** – Enables individuals to build personal responsibility, problem solving, and leadership skills through group activities, role-playing, speeches, and projects.

_____ **78460 (PLTW) DESIGN & MODELING/AUTOMATION & ROBOTICS** - Discover the design process, creativity, innovation and explore mechanical systems, automation, robotics, and computer control systems. This course may have limited availability.

_____ **883123 SKILLS FOR LIVING/FAMILY CONSUMER SCIENCE**-Introduces students to career investigations and basic life skills (budgeting, cooking, sewing, health, and independent living). Students responsible for supplying some instructional materials for this class, not to exceed \$50 (example: materials such as recipe ingredients/sewing notions).

_____ **78360 TECHNOLOGY APPLICATIONS**-Year long course to introduce students to a variety of technology resources and programs that help them learn, create, collaborate, and think critically and publish their work.

_____ **51330 DISCOVERING LANGUAGE & CULTURES** – Explore world languages and diverse cultures through a variety of learning activities. This course may have limited availability.

APPLICATION REQUIRED ELECTIVES: Student must complete/submit application; upon acceptance will be scheduled into class.

Media -Students develop media skills relevant to real world settings including surveying and researching information for news reports, producing and organizing the school announcements while practicing skills that are necessary for careers in the field of journalism.

Selection is based on grades, attendance, attitude, and teacher recommendation.

AVID Advancement Via Individual Determination prepares students for entrance into four-year colleges. Emphasis on analytical writing, preparation for college entrance/placement exams, study skills, test taking, note taking, organization, time management and research. **Requires enrollment in at least one Pre-AP class.**
